Last weekend my dad and I went down and found Bob out again vacuuming the field. It was too windy to fly so we watched the clouds of dirt coming up around the pickup trailer and worried about the amount Bob was breathing in. (Bob, the club will be happy to give you some dust masks.)

After he finished we talked and learned that he had talked with several landscapers to find out what was destroying the grass and leaving dust bowls all over the runways and pit areas. In the picture below the runway looks more like a harvested hay field than it does a nicely groomed grass runway. IT'S the CROWS!!! Hordes were gorging on the grubs that are themselves feasting on the grass roots.



During one of his day trips he witnessed the flocks of crows on the field thereby confirming the problem. Although it is too late for the 2014 season, the only solution is to apply grub killer come the spring. After the grubs die off the next step is to seed the denuded areas with the right type of grass seed.

The club must plan to purchase and apply the chemicals in the spring in addition to laying down grass seed in the denuded areas. (Likely starting shortly after the field thaws.)


Serving as long as we have, we are technically in violation of the By-Laws of the Beltzville Flying Machine Society.
