So yesterday I went on their website to the "Contact" form and sent them an email explaining the entire sad story and asking them to honor the warranty.

Nope, not another "no response" but an invalid email address per the below. Clearly Hyperion does not stand behind its products and at this point cannot recommend their products and have no plans to purchase anything from them again. I will, however, be filing claims with the BBB and other protection agencies in hopes of preventing others from the same experiences.
